ENGLEFIELD GREEN, see Egham.

EPSOM (originally "Ebbisham") derived its name from St. Ebba, a Northumbrian princess, and is a parish and market town and the head of a petty sessional division, union and county court district, delightfully situated on the western verge of Banstead Downs, on the main road from London to Dorking, Horsham, Guildford and Worthing, with stations on the London, Brighton and South Coast, South Western and South Eastern and Chatham railways, and is 15 miles south-west-by-south from London by road, 17 by the Brighton and South Coast railway, and about 14 by the South Western, 16 miles north-east from Guildford, 9 north-west from Reigate, 9 south-west from Croydon and 7 south from Kingston, in the Mid division of the county, first division of the hundred of Copthorne, rural deanery of Leatherhead, archdeaconry of Surrey and diocese of Winchester. The town is lighted with gas from works the property of the Epsom and Ewell Gas Company, formed in 1839, and also with the electric light from works in Church street: it has a constant supply of water from works the property of the Council, situated at East street, and there are two large reservoirs on the Downs: the water is of superior quality, but has about 23 degrees of hardness, arising from the chalk held in solution. The town is effectually drained and the sewage is deodorised and otherwise disposed of on an irrigation ground (part of Epsom Court farm), a portion being pumped up to higher land and returned by gravitation; the effluent, by means of a system of deep and surface drainage, is largely purified, and runs into the Hogs Mill river, by which it is discharged into the Thames at Kingston. The air of Epsom is very salubrious; part of the town lies in a natural basin, but the upper portion possesses fine downs, almost entirely open to the sea on the south side, and the temperature is thus agreeably varied. It was constituted a Local Government District 19 Mar. 1850, under the provisions of the "Public Health Act, 1848" (11 and 12 Vict. c. 63), and the government of the town vested in an Urban District Council of 9 members, formed under the provisions of the "Local Government Act, 1894" (56 and 57 Vict. c. 73); the number of members was increased to 12 in 1903. The church of St. Martin is of brick and flint with Bath stone dressings, in the Gothic style: it was rebuilt, with the exception of the tower, in 1824, at a cost of £7,000, and has a tower with spire containing a clock and 8 bells: the stained east window was erected in 1893: there is a monument, by Flaxman, to the Rev. John Parkhurst M.A. Fellow of Clare College, Cambridge, the lexicographer, who died here 21 March, 1797, and others to the Belfield, Warro and Evelyn families: the oldest memorial is a brass with the name of Marston, dated 1511: in 1907-1908, the old and small chancel was demolished and a new chancel and part of a new nave, with vestries, erected at a cost of £10,000: the new work is of stone, in the Gothic style: a memorial screen of wrought iron & bronze with a stone base was erected in 1909: there are now 950 sittings. The church was wholly closed to interments Sept. 18, 1866, and the churchyard, by the same Order, can now be used only by those having family vaults and graves. In the churchyard is a stone inscribed to Charles Parkhurst, d. 20 Dec. 1704. The register dates from the year 1635. The living is a vicarage, net income £400, with 3 acres of glebe and residence, in the gift of H. Speer esq. and held since 1904 by the Rev. Waldegrave Dent Bainbridge-Bell M.A. of Pembroke College, Cambridge, and surrogate. St. John's Mission church erected in 1884, at a cost of £2,000, is of brick with stone facings, in the Gothic style, and will seat 300 persons. Christ Church is an ecclesiastical parish, formed July 10, 1874: the church, consecrated in 1876, and since entirely rebuilt, is of flint with stone dressings, in the Decorated style, and consists of chancel, nave and a tower with belfry containing 8 bells: the decorations in the chancel form a memorial to Norman Aston esq.: the chancel arch was erected in memory of the Rev. Geo. E. Willes, first vicar of the parish: there are 600 sittings. The register dates from the year 1875. The living is a vicarage, net yearly value £240, with residence, in the gift of the Bishop of Winchester, and held since 1881 by the Rev. Archer George Hunter M.A. of Trinity College, Cambridge, hon. canon of Winchester, rural dean of Leatherhead and surrogate. The Church room in connection with Christ Church, designed by J. Hatchard Smith F.R.S.B.A. in the Gothic style, consists of a large room capable of seating 300 people, with a stage and also a large class room. St. Barnabas, formerly attached to Christ Church, is being formed into an ecclesiastical parish. The new church of St. Barnabas, in Hill road, is of red brick

and stone, but at present consists only of a chancel and two-thirds of the projected nave: the Rev. Henry A. Bowles has been curate in charge since 1910. The Catholic Church, in Heathcote road, dedicated to St. Joseph, was erected in 1857, and has 120 sittings. There is a Congregational chapel founded in 1688 and rebuilt in 1904 at a cost of £4,000, in the late Gothic style, which consists of chancel, nave, aisles and apsidal choir and has a tower on the north side 50 feet high, with copper spirelet: the chapel has 500 sittings: there are also Wesleyan and Strict Baptist chapels, and the Baptists further hold services in the Gymnasium Hall, erected in 1900. The Cemetery, in Ashley road, covering an area of about 8 acres, was completed in 1871, at a cost of £5,500. It has two mortuary chapels, and is under the control of the Urban District Council, acting as a Burial Board. The Public Hall and Assembly Rooms, erected in 1883, at a cost of £4,000, is of red brick and terra cotta, in the Classic style, from designs by Mr. J. Hatchard Smith A.R.S.A. of Epsom: it contains a large hall, 68 by 40 feet, and about 30 feet high, with a stage and dressing rooms: there are also club and reading rooms, and a lecture room, 40 by 25 feet, and about 15 feet high: the hall was opened Tuesday, April 3, 1883, by the Earl of Egmont, and will hold 500 persons. In 1906 alterations and improvements were made at a cost of over £3,000. The Technical Institute and Art School, also designed by Mr. J. Hatchard Smith, is in the Renaissance style, and was opened by the Earl of Rosebery in 1897; on the ground floor are technical class rooms, and on the first floor fully equipped art school. There are branches here of the London County & Westminster Bank, Lim. and the Capital and Counties Bank. Brick making and brewing are carried on here, and there are also nursery grounds. The market day is Wednesday, and a pleasure (3 days) fair commences on the 25th July. The old Assembly Rooms, in which balls were held in the Stuart period, now form part of Waterloo House, High street. In the centre of the High street is a clock tower with an open cupola containing one bell.

The former celebrity of Epsom was due to its medicinal springs, situated 1 mile west of the town and discovered in 1618 by one Henry Wicker; the water was at first used externally, and its purgative properties were not ascertained till about 1630; modern analyses have shown that one gallon contains 480 grains of calcareous nitre, but pure Epsom salts contain 59 parts of sulphuric acid and 41 of magnesia, forming sulphate of magnesia: in the reign of Queen Elizabeth the springs were much frequented by the country people, and in the time of Charles I. the salts they produced were so celebrated as to sell at 5s. per ounce: about 1690 a large concourse of visitors flocked hither, including members of the nobility, with their families, and numerous foreigners; and the place became for a while a highly fashionable centre, and developed every kind of popular amusement: in 1720 the wells were at their greatest splendour, but in 1804 the house at the old wells was pulled down: a new mansion was erected on its site in 1885 by the late James Stuart Strange esq.

The great modern celebrity of Epsom is derived from its races, which appear to have originated in the year 1711 although the pastime of horse racing, according to a passage in Lord Clarendon's "History of the Rebellion," existed in this neighbourhood in the days of Charles I. The "Oaks" stakes, for three-year-old fillies, were instituted in 1779 by Edward, 12th Earl of Derby, and named after his hunting-box at Woodmansterne: in the following year he instituted the famous "Derby" stakes, for three-year-old colts, and from that time until now the annual occurrence of these races has been uninterrupted. The Spring Meeting is held in April, when the "Metropolitan" and the "City and Suburban" stakes are run for, the "Derby" in May or the beginning of June, the principal days being Wednesday (the Derby day) and Friday (the Oaks day); the races take place on the Downs about a mile south of the town. The grand stand, erected in 1829-30, at an expense of £20,000, raised by 1,000 shares, was considerably enlarged and altered in 1886, at an expense of £12,000, under the direction of Mr. Hatchard Smith A.R.S.A. architect, of Epsom, and forms a prominent object on the south from the road between Ewell and Epsom. The chief hotels are the "King's Head," a house at which Popes stayed when visiting Epsom in July, 1667; and the "Spread Eagle." The H Co. 5th Territorial Force Battalion, East Surrey Regiment, have a drill hall in Hawthorne place. On the Common

is a club room, with skittle alley, for the use of working men, erected in 1880 by the late J. S. Strange esq. lord of the manor, at a cost of £700, from designs by Mr. J. Hatchard Smith.

Epsom College, erected in the year 1855, was incorporated by Acts of Parliament in that year and in 1895; the buildings are of red brick and Caen stone, in the Tudor Gothic style, and stand in grounds occupying an area of over 80 acres: in 1897 a lower school was added and the chapel enlarged: the buildings generally include a chapel, gymnasium, carpenter's shop, swimming bath, three laboratories, and there are excellent fields for cricket and football; a new science block has recently been completed, and other buildings are in progress. The College is a public school for gentlemen's sons, those of medical men being educated at a slight reduction: there are fifty foundation scholarships, open to orphan sons of medical men, who are clothed, boarded and educated gratis; attached to the College are open entrance scholarships of £30; 5 leaving scholarships to the Universities and 10 to the Hospitals. There are now 300 boys altogether, including 26 boarders in the head master's house and the others on the hostel system. Epsom and Ewell Cottage Hospital, in Alexandra road, was erected in 1889, at a cost of £2,600, raised by public subscription and opened by H.R.H. the late Princess Mary Adelaide, Duchess of Teck: in 1897 it was enlarged, and now contains 18 beds, including a paying ward. The Almshouses, founded by John Livingston, a parishioner, in 1703, for twelve poor widows, were rebuilt in 1871 upon the site of the old foundation in East street and receive twelve inmates, but are not endowed. Charities producing over £150 yearly are distributed in bread, clothing and fuel. The National Incorporated Society for Waifs and Strays (Dr. Barnardo's Home), Mittendorff House, East street, was presented to Dr. Barnardo by Miss Mittendorff, and will hold 100 boys. Hookfield is the residence of B. Braithwaite esq. J.P.; Woodcote Park, of Herbert Brooks esq. J.P.; The Grove, of The Misses Pyemont; Woodcote House, of the Rev. Edward William Northey M.A., J.P.; The Durdans, of the Earl of Rosebery K.G., K.T., P.C.; The Wells, of Mrs. Jamieson; Woodcote Hall, of Thomas Dyer Holmwood; Woodcote Grove, of Alfred Withall Aston esq. J.P. The manor formerly belonged to the abbey of Chertsey. Henry Mason esq. is steward of the

manor; manor courts are holden in April and October, at the King's Head hotel. Mrs. James Stuart Strange, who is lady of the manor, the Rev. E. W. Northey M.A. Herbert Brooks esq. and the Earl of Rosebery, are the chief landowners. The area of the parish is about 7 square miles, being about 3½ miles long and about 2 miles broad. The number of acres is 4,413, of which 944 are downs and open common, and 3,479 cultivated land, chiefly inclosed gardens and home-steads, and the site of the town, and 11 of water: rateable value, £146,114. The population in 1891 was 8,417, and 1901, 10,915, including 31 officials and 470 inmates in the workhouse and 113 officials and 699 inmates in the London County Asylum, Horton Manor. The length of the highways in the parish is about 25 miles, three of which form streets.

The population of the ecclesiastical parishes in 1901 was:— St. Martin (parish church), 7,349; Christ Church, 3,566.

Horton is a hamlet of Epsom, a mile and a half north.

HORTON MANOR, comprising 1,060 acres, has been acquired by the London County Council (Asylums Committee) for the erection of asylums for lunacy patients. The Manor Asylum will hold 1,062. "The Manor House" is the quarters of the administrative staff. Horton Asylum is available for 2,120 patients and Long Grove Asylum, opened in 1907, for 2,149 patients. The County of London Colony for Epileptics is partly in Epsom and partly in Ewell. The institution, standing in Hook road, on a portion of the estate, and built from designs of Mr. W. C. Clifford Smith, asylum's engineer, in 1902, occupies 112 acres, and is intended to provide a more home-like dwelling for certain epileptics certified as insane, who may be accorded a greater degree of liberty than in the ordinary asylum; there are beds for 323 males and 98 females, who are housed in villas; each villa being under the charge of a man and his wife; the main industry is market gardening, and for women, needlework, laundry and domestic work. The Isolation Hospital, Hook road, under the control of the Urban District Council, was enlarged in 1903, and has 22 beds.

ESHER (A. S. Æsheath, i.e. Ash-haugh) is a parish and pretty village, situated on a hill, on the Portsmouth road, near the river Mole, with a station 1 mile north-east, in the parish of Thames Ditton, on the London and South Western railway, and is 4 miles south-west from Kingston-on-Thames, 2 south-west from Thames Ditton and 14 by rail from London, in the Mid division of the county, Elmbridge hundred, Kingston petty sessional division, union and county court district, rural deanery of Emly, archdeaconry of Surrey, and diocese of Winchester. The village is lighted with gas by the Kingston Gas Company, and supplied with water by the Metropolitan Water Board. Under a scheme of the Kingston Rural Sanitary Authority in 1888-9 a system of main drainage was laid through this parish, Thames Ditton & Long Ditton at a cost of £70,000, including a sewage farm and 20 acres of land at Lower Green. The parish is governed by an Urban District Council of 21 members formed in April, 1895, under the provisions of the "Local Government Act, 1894" (56 & 57 Vict. c. 73); by Local Government Board Order No. 32,638, the district, known as "Esher and the Dittons," comprises Esher, Thames

Ditton and part of Long Ditton, and is divided into four wards.

Christ Church, which occupies a fine site on an eminence, was erected in 1853-4, at a cost of £7,200, and is a cruciform building of stone, in the Early English style, including a tower, with a spire, containing a clock and 6 bells: the chancel windows are stained and there is a marble monument to Leopold, Prince of Saxe Coburg and 1st King of the Belgians, who formerly resided at Claremont, and died 10 Dec. 1865: this monument, originally erected by H.M. Queen Victoria in St. George's Chapel, Windsor, was subsequently removed to this church: here is also a marble figure in the attitude of prayer, erected by Sir Francis Drake kt. in memory of his father, Richard Drake, Esquerry to Queen Elizabeth, who died in 1603; the effigy was removed from the old church by Sir William Richard Drake kt. F.S.A. of Otlands Lodge, Weybridge, in 1878; in the north aisle, in a niche of polished alabaster, is a marble bust, executed by Mr. F. J. Williamson, of Esher, of H.R.H. Prince Leopold, Duke of Albany K.G. who died at Cannes 28th March, 1884: there are 800 sittings, 480 being free.

EWELL, in Domesday "Etwell," is a parish and pleasant little town with a station half a mile south, on the Croydon and Epsom branch of the London and Brighton railway, and another, half a mile west on the branch of the South Western railway from Wimbledon to Leatherhead; 13 miles from London, 1 mile north-east from Epsom and 5 miles

south-east from Kingston, and was once a market town; it is in the Mid division of the county, Copthorne hundred, Epsom petty sessional division, union and county court district, rural deanery of Leatherhead, archdeaconry of Surrey and diocese of Winchester. It is lighted with gas by the Epsom and Ewell Gas Co. and supplied with water by the Sutton

Water Co. The several feeders of the Hoggs Mill river rising in this parish form its source. The ancient church of St. Mary, with the exception of the fine ivy-covered tower, till recently used as a mortuary chapel for the old churchyard, has been pulled down; the new parish church, erected at a cost of £7,174, and consecrated 24 August, 1848, is of stone, in the Early English style, and has a tower, containing a clock and 8 bells: there is a finely-carved marble figure of Sir William Lewen, knight, alderman and lord mayor of London, who died in 1717, as well as several ancient brasses and memorials removed from the old church, to the Monro, Calverley, Glyn Lewen, Dowdeswell and Bulkeley families, and ten memorial windows; in 1893 the church was renovated; in 1898 a pulpit of alabaster and marble was presented, and in 1908 a west porch was added, both gifts of E. W. Martin esq.: the church now affords more than 1,000 sittings, 430 being free. The register dates from the year 1604. The living is a vicarage, net income £250, with 7 acres of glebe, in the gift of Sir Gervas Powell Glyn bart. lay rector, and held since 1906 by the Rev. Walter Weston M.A., F.R.G.S. of Clare College, Cambridge. The vicarage house was built in 1883, and a Church Room was given by the Rev. John Thornton M.A. vicar 1890-1901. The church of All Saints, at West Ewell, is in the Early Decorated style. There is a Congregational chapel with a school and public lecture hall adjoining, built in 1864: the chapel will seat 300 persons. Extensive pottery and brick and tile works are maintained on the Nonsuch estate, and there are two large flour mills, worked by water and steam power from numerous springs rising in the town and neighbourhood, forming the head of the Hoggs Mill river. Charities of over £300 yearly value are distributed in bread and clothing, and scholarships; two-thirds being given to this parish and one-third to Kingswood. Ewell was the birthplace in 1582 of Richard Corbet D.D. bishop of Oxford (1628-32), and of Norwich (1632-5). Ewell Castle, erected in 1804, is a mansion with embattled parapets and octagonal turrets at the angles, and is now the residence of Capt. Clarence Wiener; in the grounds is a site of a banqueting house belonging to the palace of Nonsuch, built by King Henry the Eighth and situated in Cuddington parish; the remains are surrounded by a wall with bastions at intervals. The principal landowners are Sir Gervas Powell Glyn bart. John Henry Bridges esq. J.P. the Rev. E. W. Northey M.A. of Epsom, who is lord of the manor of Ewell, James Philip Gadesden esq. of Burley, Woolton Hill, Newbury, and Major Sir Edward Feetham Coates bart. M.P., D.L., J.P. The soil is clay; subsoil, chalk. The chief crops are wheat, oats and barley. The area is 2,427 acres of land and 10 acres of water; rateable value, £26,665; the population of the civil parish in 1901 was 3,338, including 730 in Kensington and Chelsea district workhouse schools.

EWHRUST is a parish and village, 3 miles north-east from Cranleigh station on the Guildford and Horsham section of the London, Brighton and South Coast railway, 35 from London and 12 south-east from Guildford, 11 miles from Dorking, in the South Western division of the county, hundred of Blackheath. Guildford petty sessional division, Hambleton union, Guildford and Godalming county court district, rural deanery of Guildford, archdeaconry of Surrey and diocese of Winchester. The church of SS. Peter and Paul, restored in 1838, is a cruciform building of stone in the Perpendicular style, and has a central tower with spire, containing a clock and 6 bells: there are 306 sittings. The register dates from the year 1614. The living is a rectory, net yearly value £300, including 60 acres of glebe with residence, in the gift of the Lord Chancellor, and held since 1898 by the Rev. Archibald Ewart Clark-Kennedy B.A. of Corpus Christi College, Cambridge. The Church Hall was erected in 1903. Here is a

Congregational Chapel. A charity of £50 yearly, left by Henry Smith, of Wandsworth, and alderman of London, who died 30 Jan. 1628, is distributed by the Parish Council. Ewhurst Place is the residence of William Rigby esq. and Woolpits of Henry Lewis Doulton esq. The principal landowners are the Hon. Sir Reginald More Bray of Shere (who is the principal lord of the manor), Lord Abinger, Walter Webb esq. and Thomas James Waller esq. of Baynards Park. The soil is various: subsoil, clay and sand. The chief crops are wheat, barley, oats and turnips. The area is 5,417 acres; rateable value, £8,653; the population in 1901 was 996.
