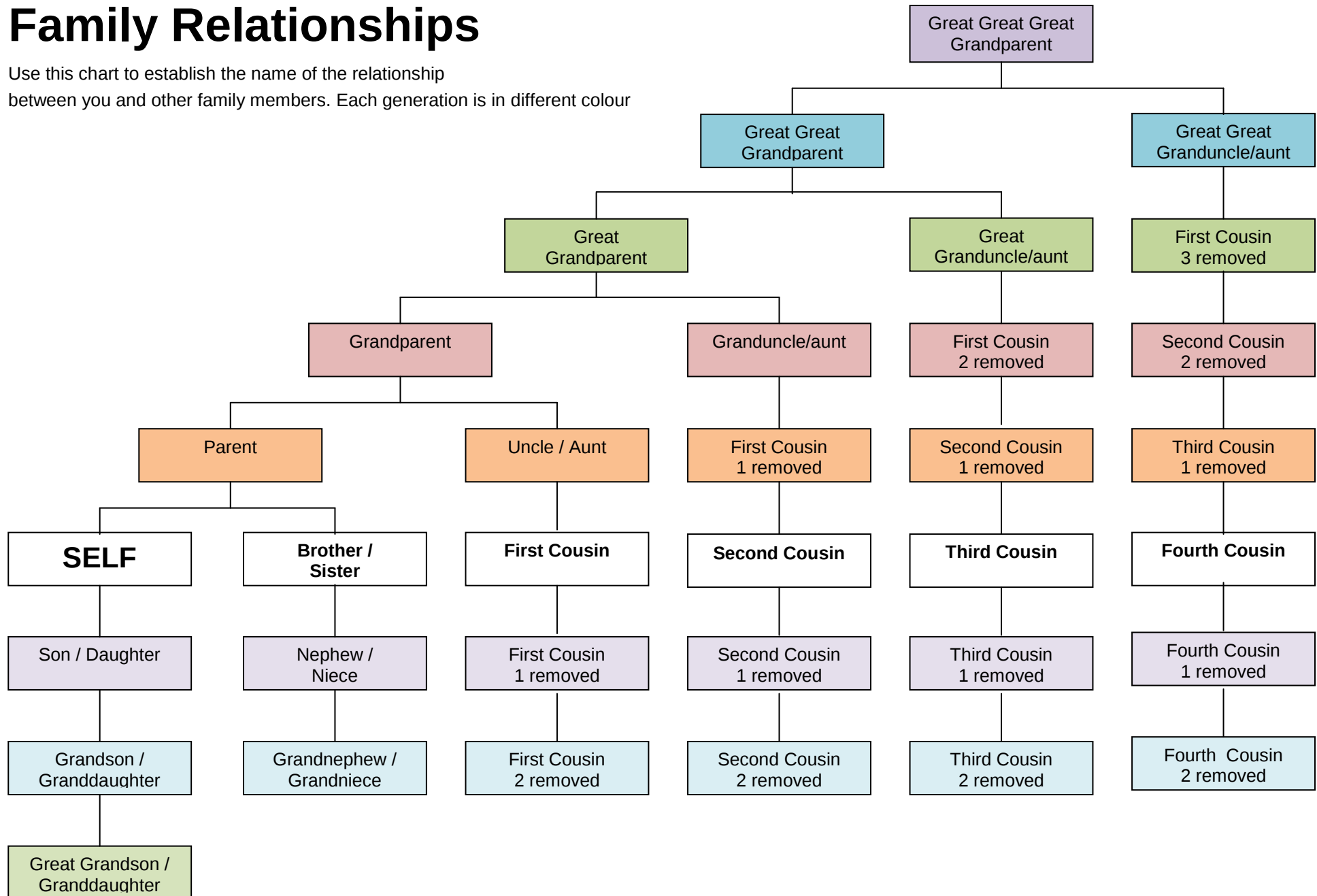


Family Relationships

Use this chart to establish the name of the relationship between you and other family members. Each generation is in different colour



Family Relationships

Use this chart to establish the name of the relationship between two family members.

How to use the chart

1. Identify the closest common ancestor
2. Identify the generations from the common ancestor for the first person along the top column.
3. Identify the generations from the common ancestor for the second person in the left hand row.
4. Where the relevant column and row intersects read off the relationship.

Example: The great grand child of the common ancestor (3rd generation) and the grand child (2nd generation) of the same ancestor are said to be first cousins once removed.

Notes:

1. The boxes with bold text show persons of the same generation.
2. "Removed " merely means that the individuals are not of the same generation so twice removed just means that there are two generations difference between the individuals.
3. You can extend the table as necessary.
