AIR RAID PRECAUTIONS SCHEME.

General Information for the Assistance of Air Raid Wardens.

The Corporation take this opportunity of thanking those volunteers who have devoted so much of their time in the furtherance of this scheme.

PROTECTION OF HOMES AGAINST AIR RAIDS.

The Home Office has supplied a booklet to householders which indicates how to counter the danger of air attack in the home. This book should be studied with care and Air Raid Wardens are asked to assist the householder, if called upon, and advise how the instructions contained therein should be carried out.

It is emphasised that the measures taken by the Government and the Corporation are wholly precautionary and are such as have been taken by the majority of European nations, and it is the essence of such precautions that the civil

population should be informed of the possibilities of air attack and instructed in precautions designed to meet it.

The Corporation hope to arrange short lectures to the public on Anti-gas measures in the near future.

The problem of the protection of school children in time of air attack is under the consideration of the Local Educational Authority, who will deal entirely with that side of Air Raid Precautions.

AIR RAID WARDENS.

The Wardens' organisation and their duties in peace time and in war are fully set out in the A.R.P. Handbook No. 8, which should be studied with the utmost care.

It will be of vital importance in time of war in order to ensure the satisfactory working of the Air Raid Precautions Scheme, that wardens set a high standard of cool resourcefulness and courage, and by example, personality and every other means in their power prevent panic amongst the civilian population.

The general public will look to wardens for assistance and will rely upon them for guidance in an emergency.

WARDENS' REPORT OF CASUALTIES AND DAMAGE.

There will be Wardens' posts in all parts of the Borough, and reports from Wardens will form one of the quickest sources of information about the fall of bombs. Home Office special reporting forms will be supplied to Wardens and should be used when reporting to the Report Centre casualties or damage, which may have occurred within the area for which the warden is responsible.

Members of the public are discouraged from using the telephone under air raid conditions. Essential public services will need the telephone facilities and their work will be hampered if the telephone lines are clogged with messages from private individuals.

Members of the public are advised to communicate their needs through the Air Raid Wardens, patrolling police officers and other members of the A.R.P. services, who are at hand, and only to use the telephone for the most urgent messages when no other means of securing help is available.

ALL messages should be sent by Wardens to the Report Centre at the Town Hall, Epsom (Epsom 1030).

LIGHTING RESTRICTIONS IN TIME OF WAR.

All occupiers of premises used after dark will be required for the duration of war to mask all windows, sky-lights and doors at night with dark blinds, curtains, or other means so that no light inside such premises will be visible from outside. External lights will be forbidden.

All illuminated advertisements and signs (other than signs installed specially for A.R.P. purposes) are forbidden.

Normal street lighting will be extinguished.

Restrictions will be imposed on lights carried by road vehicles. The use of motor-car head-lamps can only be allowed if they are heavily screened.

UNEXPLODED BOMBS.

The position of unexploded bombs or shells should be notified immediately to Air Raid Wardens or police constables, who will arrange through the Report Centre for the Military Authority to remove them or make them safe. **Under no circumstances** should members of the public touch them.

PROTECTION OF FOODSTUFFS.

So far as domestic supplies are concerned there is one rule to be observed, *i.e.*, if there is any chance of an air raid taking place, see that all food stuffs are placed in air-tight tins; any tin with a well fitting lid will do. If the lid is not air-tight, thick strips of adhesive plaster or gummed strips should be placed round the lid. Food in tins or bottles is quite safe as it is.

Should the air-tight tins be contaminated with liquid gas, the tins should be swabbed with petrol or paraffin and then washed, and the food inside will be unharmed.

Certain war gases contain arsenic, so take no chances and protect your food as described above. If any food has a suspicious smell or taste after an air raid, destroy it.

SHELTERS.

Attention is drawn to the desirability of the public remaining in their own homes or in other buildings during an air raid. Although the premises and position of trenches set out in this book are available for persons caught in the streets, it cannot be too strongly emphasised that the public should avoid going out in the open unnecessarily when a raid is imminent.

AMENDMENTS.

The risk of injury by gas will be reduced to a minimum by the observance of the following rules—

- (i) Immediately on hearing an air raid warning, take cover in a gas protected room or shelter, unless a public duty compels a person to go out of doors or remain at work in an unprotected place.
- (ii) Be sure your respirator is handy in the room or shelter.
- (iii) Do not come out of the room or shelter until the "all clear" signal is given by handbells.
- (iv) If duty prevents a person taking cover during a raid, the respirator should be ready to put on at once.
- (v) Be sure that your respirator straps are adjusted so that the respirator fits readily.

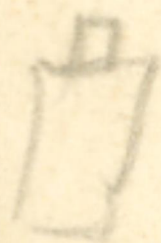

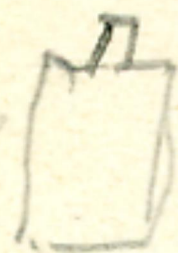
